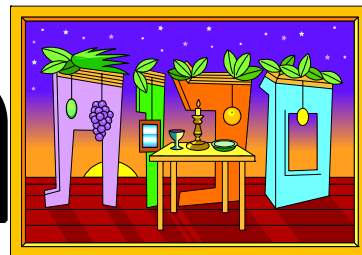

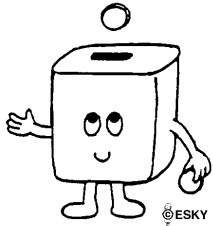

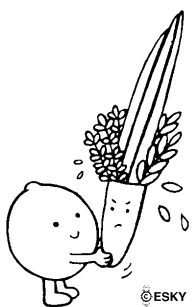
Last week during the Aseres Y'mai Teshuva, the 1st and 2nd graders had their first "Rosh Chodesh" activity, led by our very talented Morah Matanky. The classes gathered in the Bais Medrash for an introduction to the activity which included knowing

the Hebrew dates for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and reminding everyone that during those days, the Aseres Y'mai Teshuva, there are three Mitzvos we try to do to help us in the coming year. The classes were then divided into three groups and went from station to station to discover the three Mitzvos. At one station, Morah Cziment played a game with the students where they divided up Mitzvos Bein Adam L'Makom (between man and Hashem) and Mitzvos Bein Adam L'Chaveiro (between man and man). When all the Mitzvos Bein Adam L'Chavero were chosen, their cards were turned over and they spelled out the word, "SORRY". The yeladim learned that in order to do Teshuva they would need to say "sorry" to their families and friends for things they had done wrong. Each child received a magnetic "sorry button" and a piece to a puzzle. At another station, Morah Grinblatt taught the song, "Achas Sha'alti" which is part of our special tefila said between Rosh Chodesh Elul and Shemini Atzeres. There, the yeladim each received a songsheet and two puzzle pieces. The final station was led by Morah Shapiro, and there each child made their very own Tzedakah box. Each child left with their Tzedakah box and two more puzzle pieces. When everyone was done with all three stations, the yeladim went back to their own classrooms to work on their puzzles. Each child was given a special piece of paper to glue their own puzzle. When the yeladim were done gluing they saw that the puzzles spelled out:

We are Bucket Fillers in Room 306! In Mrs. Zuckerman's 1st grade boys' class, the boys listened to a great book called Have you Filled a Bucket Today by Carol McLeod. This is a captivating book that not only teaches students how to make

someone else happy, but it also shows them how they can be happy too! You see, every person has an imaginary bucket. The students all have imaginary buckets. Their Moms and Dads all have imaginary buckets; even the custodians in our school have imaginary buckets! When we are happy our buckets are full and when we are sad our buckets are empty. Our job is to make people happy and fill their buckets. It's fun and easy too! When you see someone at recess who is sad, and you invite him to play with you, you filled his bucket. 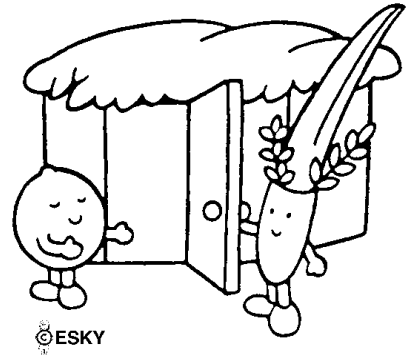

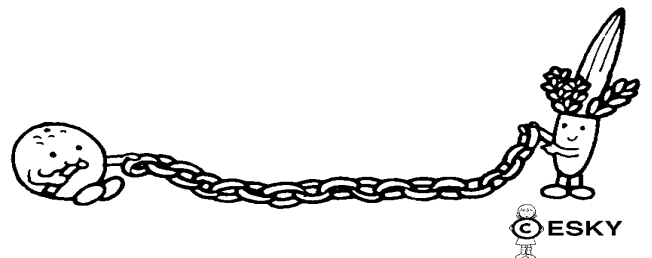
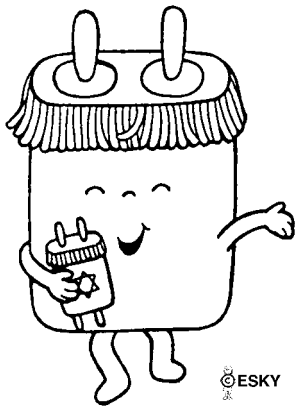
