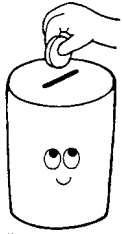

## Health Corner

Packages of ACETAMINOPHIN (Tylenol) and NSAIDS like aspirin and ibuprofen (ADVIL, MOTRIN) will soon carry new warning labels to better alert us to risks of stomach bleeding (with NSAIDS) and liver damage (from acetaminophen). These are serious health issues and should not be taken lightly. Many people (ADULTS and CHILDREN) take Tylenol, Motrin or Advil for headaches, fever and minor aches and pains without thinking twice. Many people don't realize that you can take too much and cause SERIOUS harm. Taking too much could mean taking the medication too often or it could be taking too much at one time. These medications might also be part of a combination medication, like some cold medicines, and taking the cold medication in addition to Tylenol would be considered "an overdose".

Fever is the body's natural response to fighting infection and not ALL fevers require medication. It is a good idea to discuss this with your healthcare provider BEFORE your child gets sick so that you feel more confident when he or she has fever and it's 2 AM!!!

Pain management is a very big topic, too big for this health corner, but here are a few suggestions. First think of a scale from 1 to 10, 1 being almost no pain and 10 being totally unbearable pain, and assign a number to your pain. Then try to figure out what could be contributing to the pain. Hunger, dehydration, stress, lack of sleep or an injury are some of the most common causes of pain. Try to address the possible cause before reaching for medication (unless otherwise directed by your healthcare provider). Eating a nutritious snack, drinking a full glass of water, or a 20 minute rest might help relieve the pain. Ice and elevation or heat and/ or gentle massage might be helpful if you think the pain is due to a minor injury.

The makers of Tylenol have recently recalled more than 20 types of children's and infant's medications as a precaution against possible contamination. The recalled products include: Children's Tylenol Cold MS Suspension 4 oz. Grape, Children's Tylenol Plus Cough & Runny Nose 4 oz. Cherry, and Infant's Tylenol Suspension Drop 1 oz. Grape. The recalled products were made between April and June 2008. Consumers with concerns about the recalled products are asked to call McNeil Consumer Call Care Center at 1-800-962-5357. 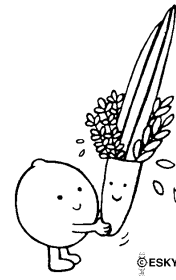
