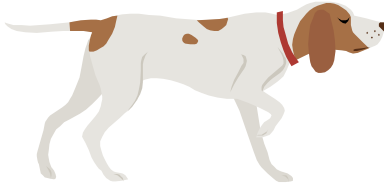
LIBRARY NEWS

Health Corner

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), which causes infection of the lungs, is a major cause of respiratory illness in young children. In premature babies and kids with chronic illnesses, RSV infections can lead to other more serious illnesses. In adults, it may only produce symptoms of a common cold and a general feeling of being ill.

RSV is highly contagious and can be spread through droplets containing the virus when someone coughs or sneezes. It also can live on surfaces (such as countertops or doorknobs) and on hands and clothing, so can be easily spread when a person touches something contaminated. Frequent hand washing is key in preventing its transmission.

Keep your school-age child with a cold away from younger siblings — particularly infants — until the symptoms pass because babies often get RSV when older kids carry the virus home from school and pass it to them. RSV infections often occur in epidemics that last from late fall through early spring. Respiratory illness caused by RSV — such as bronchiolitis or pneumonia — usually lasts about a week, but some cases may last several weeks.

Call the doctor if your child has any of these symptoms:

- * high fever with ill appearance
- * thick nasal discharge
- * worsening cough or cough that produces yellow, green, or gray mucus
- * signs of dehydration

In infants, besides the symptoms already mentioned, call the doctor if your baby is unusually irritable or inactive, or refuses to breastfeed or bottle-feed.

Seek immediate medical help if you feel your child is having difficulty breathing or is breathing very rapidly, is lethargic, or if his or her lips or fingernails appear blue.

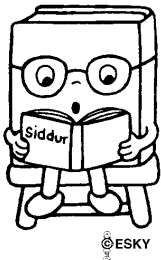
