Health Corner

MUMPS

For the past 7 MONTHS there has been a mumps outbreak in New York, New Jersey and Quebec. It has now exceeded 1500 cases and has been traced back to a boy who came to camp from England. It spread quickly to other boys in camp and then throughout various neighborhoods once the boys went home. Many of the affected children WERE IMMUNIZED but some were not. You can find more information about the outbreak on the CDC website (go to www.cdc.gov and see MMWR November 20, 2009 / 58 (45); 1270-1274) and many news periodicals.

Mumps is a disease caused by a virus that usually spreads through saliva. Because mumps is caused by a virus, it cannot be treated with antibiotics.

The incubation period for mumps can be 12 to 25 days, but the average is 16 to 18 days. Signs and symptoms include;

* fever of up to 103° Fahrenheit

* headache

* loss of appetite

* swelling and pain in the parotid glands, in the area between the ear and jaw, for the first 1 to 3 days

* Complaints of difficulty swallowing, talking, chewing, or drinking (especially acidic juices like orange juice).

* Most cases of mumps are seen in kids ages 5 to 14.

Complications include encephalitis and meningitis. Orchitis is a rare complication in adolescent males that can cause fertility problems.

The mumps virus is contagious and spreads in tiny drops of fluid from the mouth and nose of someone who is infected. It can be passed to others through sneezing, coughing, or even laughing. The virus can also spread to other people through direct contact, such as picking up tissues or using drinking glasses that have been used by an infected person. Hand hygiene (hand sanitizer or soap and warm water) can help reduce the spread of ALL GERMS, including the mumps.

People who have mumps are most contagious from 2 days before symptoms begin to 6 days after they end. The virus can also spread from people who are infected but have no symptoms. In some cases, signs and symptoms are so mild that no one suspects a mumps infection.

Mumps can only be prevented by vaccination. The vaccine is given as part of the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) immunization, which is usually given to children at 12 to 15 months of age. A second dose of MMR is generally given at 4 to 6 years of age. During a mumps outbreak, your doctor may recommend additional shots of the vaccine. If you think that your child has mumps, call your doctor, who can confirm the diagnosis and work with you to monitor your child and watch for complications. The doctor can also notify the health authorities who keep track of childhood immunization programs and mumps outbreaks.

Please keep this important information in mind as you travel or host friends and family for Pesach. If your child has not been immunized yet for the mumps please talk to your doctor immediately, especially if you plan to have contact with friends and relatives from the affected communities in New York, New Jersey or Quebec. Vaccines are available through the Skokie Health Department, for unimmunized individuals who attend school in Skokie. They only charge \$5 at the Skokie Board of Health but you must make an appointment. More information will be available soon.

If your child is diagnosed with any communicable disease, including mumps, please inform the school office immediately.

PLEASE SHARE THIS WITH ANYONE YOU THINK MIGHT BENEFIT FROM THIS INFORMATION.

Please note that the Skokie Board of Health will immunize adults (parents, faculty and staff) whose immunization status is unknown, who only had one dose of MMR or who is unimmunized for MMR and whose children go to school in Skokie or if they work in one of the schools in Skokie. These shots cost \$5 and are by appointment only. They will also immunize any students in Skokie schools who are unimmunized or only have one dose of MMR. At the moment they are not offering a third dose here but that might change. With many, many people traveling for Pesach this is bound to spread outside of New York, New Jersey and Canada. It's just a matter of time. I am still waiting for information from the Chicago Board of Health.

Boys' Student Council News

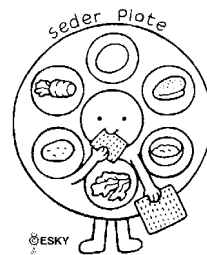
