If your child has any medication in the school office, please come in and pick it up. You may call and give older children (6th grade and up) permission to take their own medication home. Anything left in the office after June 18th will be discarded. Thank you.



Summer vacation is right around the corner. Long days and less structure are synonymous with summer fun. Somewhere there is a safe and healthy balance between parental supervision and a child's need to learn independence. The trick is finding that right balance. Some things are negotiable; Something, like safety, is not. Adult supervision is the most important part of preventing accidents in the first place.

- * Insist on bike helmets when the kids go out for a ride. Set a good example by wearing one too.
- * Remind kids to drink before, during and after playing outside on a hot and humid day.
- * Teach them to come inside if they feel overheated.
- * Help apply sunscreen (liberally) to everyone over 6 months old everyday 30 minutes before leaving the house even on a cloudy day. Any tanning or burning causes skin damage.
- * Learn to recognize insects that can cause harm like a brown recluse spider, black widow spider, deer tick, etc. and call the doctor if you suspect that your child was bitten by any of these insects.
- * Remove the stinger and clean the area well if stung by a bee and seek medical attention if the child appears to be in any kind of distress.
- * Dress kids in socks and closed shoes, long sleeves and long pants and spray with insect repellent that contains DEET when hiking in wooded areas to protect them from tick bites and possible Lyme disease.
- * Summer is also the season for West Nile Virus so make sure there isn't any standing water outside that would be a breeding ground for mosquitoes.
- * Kids need **constant adult supervision** anywhere around water even if they know how to swim. Drowning can happen in a body of water as small as a bucket or as large as the ocean and everything in between. If a large group of kids are in the water together designate one adult who will be responsible to watch the kids and then switch after 15 or 20 minutes.
- * Also insist on adult supervision if children go to play on a backyard trampoline and remind them often that only one child should be jumping at a time. (Trampolines are not recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics for home use.)

I wish everyone a safe, happy, healthy and relaxing summer and I'm looking forward to seeing everyone again in the fall.
