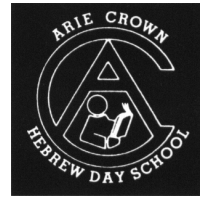

Bus/Carpool Notice

We would like to thank all of our parents and staff for their cooperation with our pickup and dismissal procedures. Working together will enable us to ensure a safer and smoother process.



In cooperation with the Skokie Police Department, please note the following:

MORNING: Parents will be allowed to stop on Main Street for a few moments to drop off their children only. If you leave your car for even a moment, the police will ticket you. **The Kilpatrick parking lot is for teachers only.**

If you wish to drop your child off near that entrance, it must be from Kilpatrick Street.

Pre-School Parents who would like to bring their children inside the building should park on either side of Kenton or in the Kenton Parking Lot. Those wishing to park on the west side of Kenton must go around the building on Elm Terrace and come around onto Kenton. **Please be careful not to speed, and pay extra attention to stay on the correct side of the road while driving on Elm Terrace. K-turns and double parking on Kenton are strictly prohibited. Using driveways to turn around is illegal and will be ticketed by the Skokie Police.** Drop-off for pre-school begins at 8:20 AM. To help support larger carpools, designated drop-off rooms are available for pre-school children who arrive between 8:10 and 8:20 AM. Please note: There is no supervision before 8:10 AM.

AFTERNOON: The North Side of Main Street and the West side of Kenton are reserved for buses only – if you stop for even a moment, you will be subject to a ticket. The Kilpatrick parking lot will be available at 3:55 p.m. for those who choose to carpool instead of using the bus.

If you are parking on Main Street **ANY OTHER TIME** during the day, please do not park directly in front of the school in order to leave space for deliveries.

Even if you are here to do a job (i.e. drink mom, library, etc.) please get a visitor's pass. The safety of our children is worth the little bit of inconvenience.

This year, all parents will receive the Yediot via e-mail each Friday. Until Sukkos break, we will continue with last year's hand-out procedure in which the youngest child in each family will receive a newsletter. After Sukkos, we will send the Yediot out ONLY by e-mail. If you do not have easy access to a computer and printer, and/or would like to continue receiving a hard copy of the Yediot, please call the school office, or e-mail your request to Yediot@ariecrown.org and we will be happy to send a copy home with your child.

BUS INFO: We thank you for your patience as everyone gets used to the new routes and any changes. Concerns and change requests can be emailed to bus@ariecrown.org. Keep in mind that in order to be fair to all the students, routes need to be as streamlined as possible and as such any changes or stop additions will be very difficult to get approved.

Helpful tip – talk to your neighbors to see if you can arrange a “bus stop-pool.” You can take turns meeting the bus and making sure that everyone’s kids get home safely.

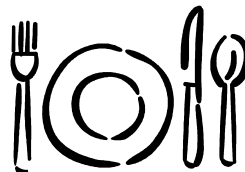

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY



About 22 million students nationwide begin and end their school day on a bus. Buses are considered nearly 2,000 times safer than the family car. Most student injury or death is not from crashes, but due to entering and exiting the bus. Here are some common bus safety tips for your

children:

- Have a safe place to wait for the bus, away from traffic and the street.
- Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop and the driver signals to enter.
- The area around the school bus is considered the 'Danger Zone.' Students are advised to stay five large steps from the front of the bus and three large steps from the side of the bus when walking around it. NEVER walk behind the bus and stay away from the wheel wells.
- At your stop, wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from your seat.

Homework Club a.k.a. "After School Study Hall"



The Homework Club is back in session under the supervision of Ms. Lindsay Zelikow (room 305) on Mondays and Wednesdays and Ms. Jori Kovarsky (room 303) on

Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Participating students report to room 305 or 303 at 4 PM with their assignment books and homework materials. They can also bring a snack. Students are to be picked up at 5 PM in front of the school. Please be on time or we will charge extra for making us wait. If you come past 5:15 PM it will be an additional \$1 for every minute after that. Parents should contact Ms. Kovarsky and/or Ms. Zelikow at school to confirm their child's participation. The cost is \$5 per session for a pay-as-you-go option. A pack of twenty sessions may be purchased for \$80 for one child, \$150 for two children, and \$210 for three or more children. This is not a private tutoring session; however, the teachers will assist students in organizing their materials and getting started on their homework assignments. When students forget materials, they are just a brief walk away from retrieving the needed items.

Students often feel more motivated to complete their assignments at school so that they can have "free time" when they go home. This relieves the parents from the need to nag their children about their assignments as well. For those who don't complete all of their work in the time allotted, they can go home focused on putting the finishing touches on what's left.

Health Corner

Welcome back to school. We are looking forward to a healthy and productive year.

Health forms and immunizations are REQUIRED for all new students, Pre 1A and 6th graders and are due NOW. Vision forms are REQUIRED for all students in Kindergarten (aka Pre 1A) and older students who have never been to school in the State of Illinois. These forms are due NOW.

Dental forms are REQUIRED for all students in Kindergarten (aka Pre 1A), 2nd and 6th grades.

All forms are available through the school office and online.

If you have not already handed in these forms please do so immediately.

There are **emergency action plans** available in the school office for children with **asthma and / or food allergies**.

Please ask your health care provider to complete the form and return it to the school office with the appropriate medication(s).

Please understand that we need BOTH the emergency (medical) action plan signed by the doctor (this acts as the "doctor's order") AND the medication.

Expired medication will not be accepted so please check the expiration dates before sending epi-pens or inhalers to school. Only emergency medications, prescribed by your health care provider should be sent to school. Please make sure it is in the original container clearly labeled with the child's name.

Over the counter (OTC) medication should never be put in a child's backpack or lunch box. If your child requires medication during the school day please call the school office.

Thank you for your prompt attention to these important matters.

Dear Arie Crown Parents: Welcome back to a wonderful new, exciting year in speech! I am looking forward to seeing all my former students and greeting my new ones. In the first few weeks of school I will be screening all first graders, students new to this school (at the parents' or teacher's request), and returning students previously enrolled in 2010-2011 for speech eligibility. My goal is to get students in and out of speech as quickly as possible, thus home practice is essential! The more diligent the child is at practicing, the sooner they will remediate the speech disorder.

* Speech services fill up very quickly; therefore, if you have any speech concerns about your children, fill out the speech request form in the office or call the school and leave your child's name, grade, teacher, and reason for concern (i.e. articulation, stuttering, etc.)
